POLICY DOCUMENT FOR DISABLED-FRIENDLY, BARRIER FREE ENVIRONMENT

As per the policy formulated by the Government of India in February 2006 for persons with disabilities (which deals with Physical, Educational & Economic Rehabilitation of persons with disabilities), institute takes utmost care for providing the disabled friendly barrier free environment for such students, parents, teaching and supporting staff. The institute is abiding to create an environment of inclusive education for all. The policy draft is prepared for the peoples with disability to know the facilities provided by the institute.

- As far as possible, institute avoids the word 'disabled person' and use the word 'special person'.
- The institute never highlights the person with disability in any way rather it promotes the inclusive participative teaching learning activity for all.
- All the staff/students should respect and act politely with special person. Any discrimination of special person will be liable for punishment.
- Providing building entry, classroom, laboratory, library, seminar room, auditorium, toilets are accessible for all types of differently abled persons.
- Ensure barrier free entry supported with ramps.
- Providing assistance in examination in the form of extra time, reader, scribe as per the university and college examination committee guidelines.
- Providing human assistance if needed in any kind of the movement in college premises with dedicated supporting staff.
- Mentors of disabled learners take extra efforts to motivate them for active participation in curriculum, co-curriculum and extra curriculum in campus and off campus events.
- In the queue (if any) preference is given to the special person.
- Providing wheel chair, medical room, rest room and elevator facility for disabled person and person under medical treatment/emergency.
- To provide teaching aids with subtitles for hearing impairment disabled person.
- To provide Screen reader (Non Visual Desktop Access (NVDA) is free; open-source software) an assistive software program accessible for visually impaired person through computer room.

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
